Location of the workshop:

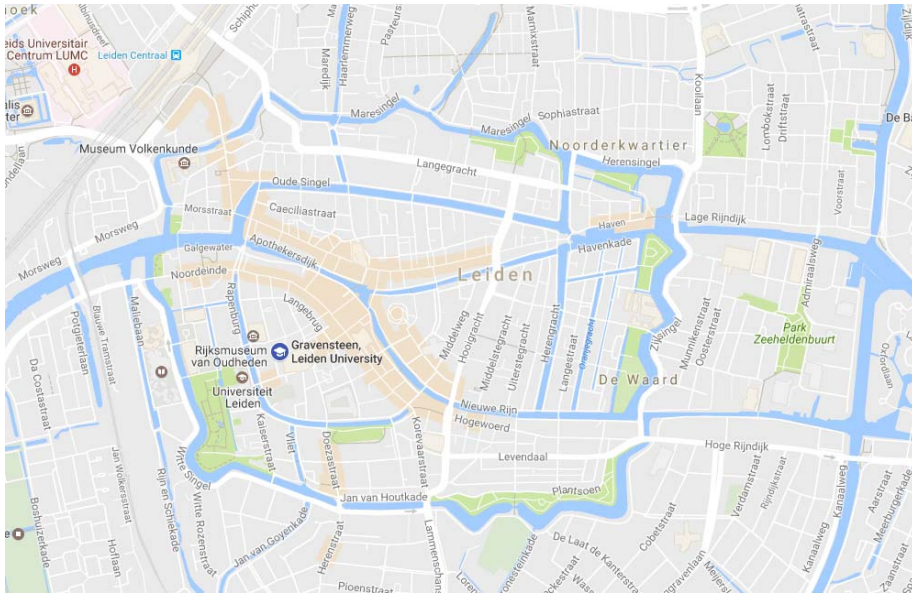


The workshop is organized in the historical, downtown area of Leiden, in the so-called Gravensteen. The Gravensteen building is monument, which served throughout the ages as a house, prison, bookstore, as well as university building. The Gravensteen was built early 13th century. Initially, it served as a house for the Dukes of Holland. In 1463, the City of Leiden started to use the building as a prison, while punishments were executed on the square in front of the building. Walking through the building, one can see many of the historical traces of the building's past.

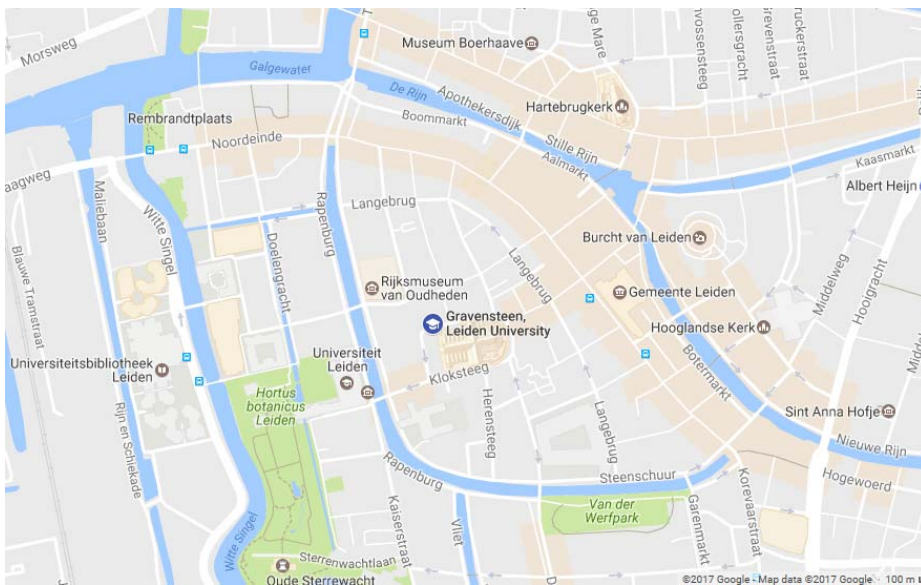

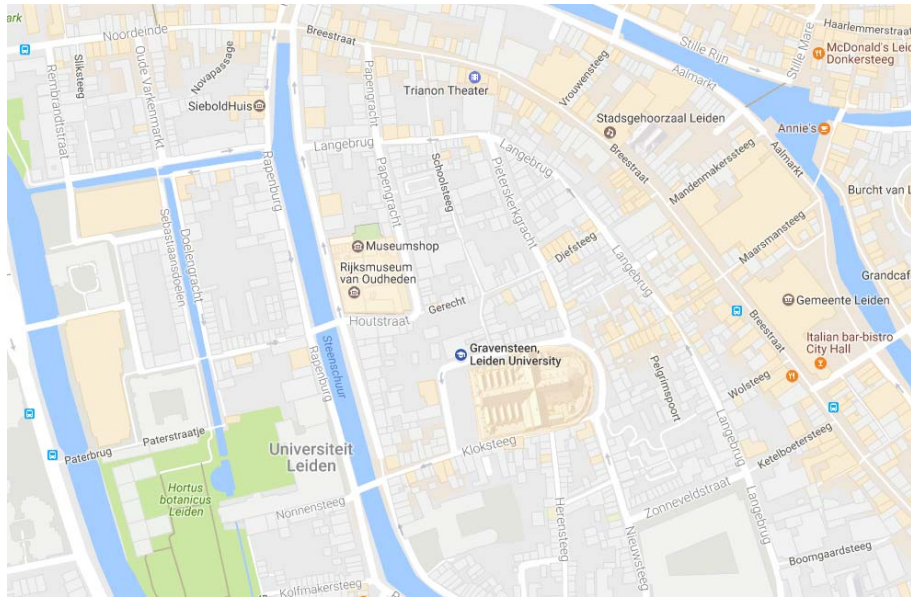
